- **Financing problems**

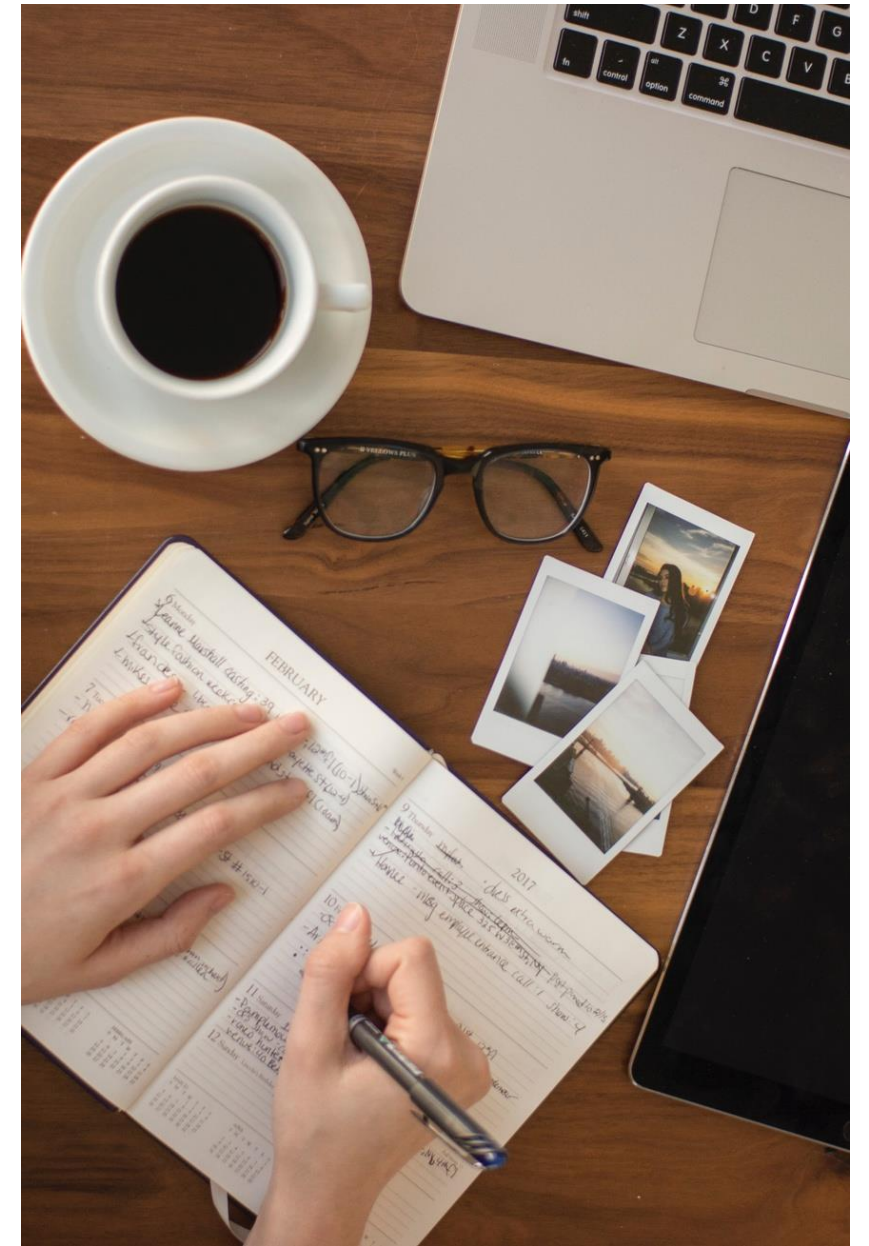
Issues securing funds cause payment delays.

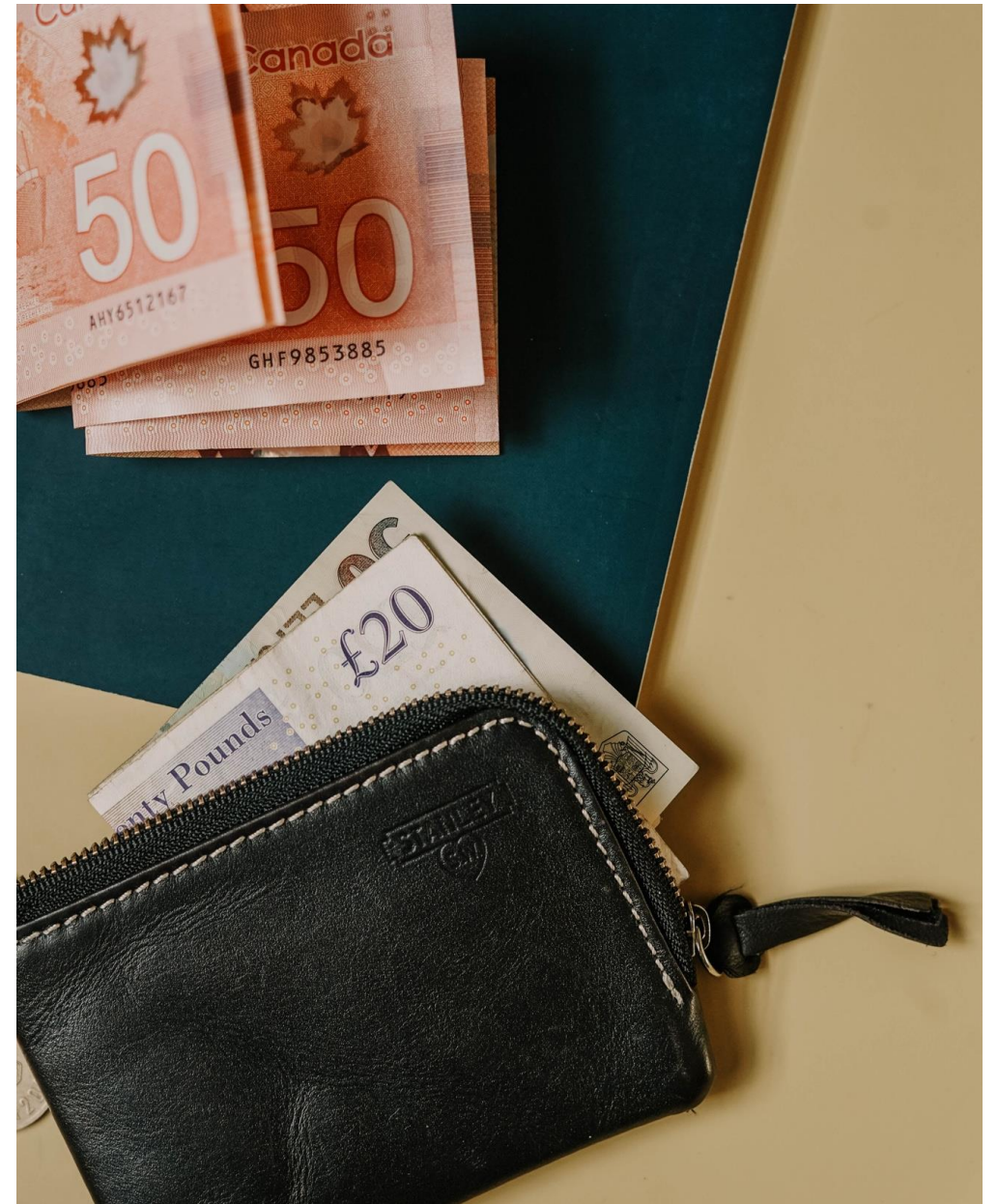

# Canada's Prompt Payment Act

Canada's Prompt Payment Act, introduced in 2019, aims to address the issue of delayed payments in the construction industry. Under this legislation, contractors and subcontractors involved in construction projects have the right to receive timely payments for their work. The Act sets out specific timelines for payment, including the requirement for owners to pay contractors within 28 days and for contractors to pay their sub-contractors within seven days of receiving payment.



# Accurate Invoicing



Carefully review the payment terms outlined in the contract to understand payment schedules, milestones, and required documentation.

Closely track project timelines, deliverables, and milestones to ensure invoices accurately reflect completed work.

Invoices should clearly state payment amounts due, payment terms, and remittance details.

Include all required information like invoice number, dates, location of work, taxes etc. as per contract.

Attach any required supporting documents like timesheets, receipts, Lien waiver, progress reports etc.

Double check invoice for accuracy regarding services, amounts, dates, and calculations before sending.
